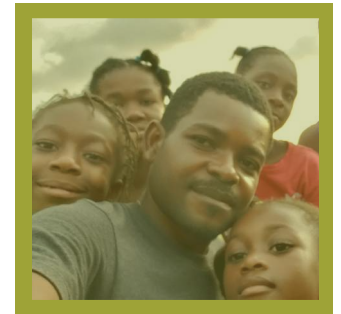

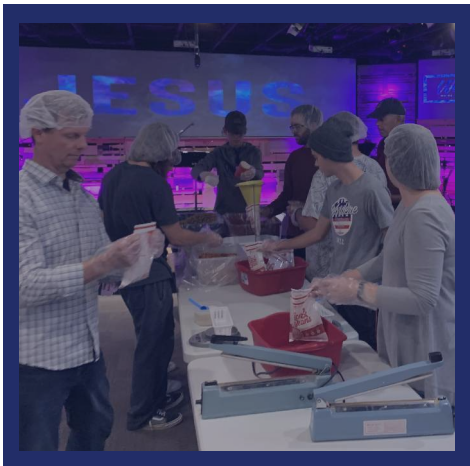

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Care of Children: \$202,567

Funds spent on support of seven schools, child sponsorship, education, and care for vulnerable children.

Relief and support: \$42,899

Funds spent on food programs, disaster relief, community health, and church support.

Family and community growth: \$7,569

Funds spent on clean water, sustainable agriculture programs, and family support.

Support of Haitian staff: \$36,988

Funds expended to support in-Haiti ministry, Haiti/U.S. communications, and other program staff support.

Administrative costs: \$128,485

Finance expenses, technology, and administrative costs limited to the U.S.

Fundraising costs: \$38,449

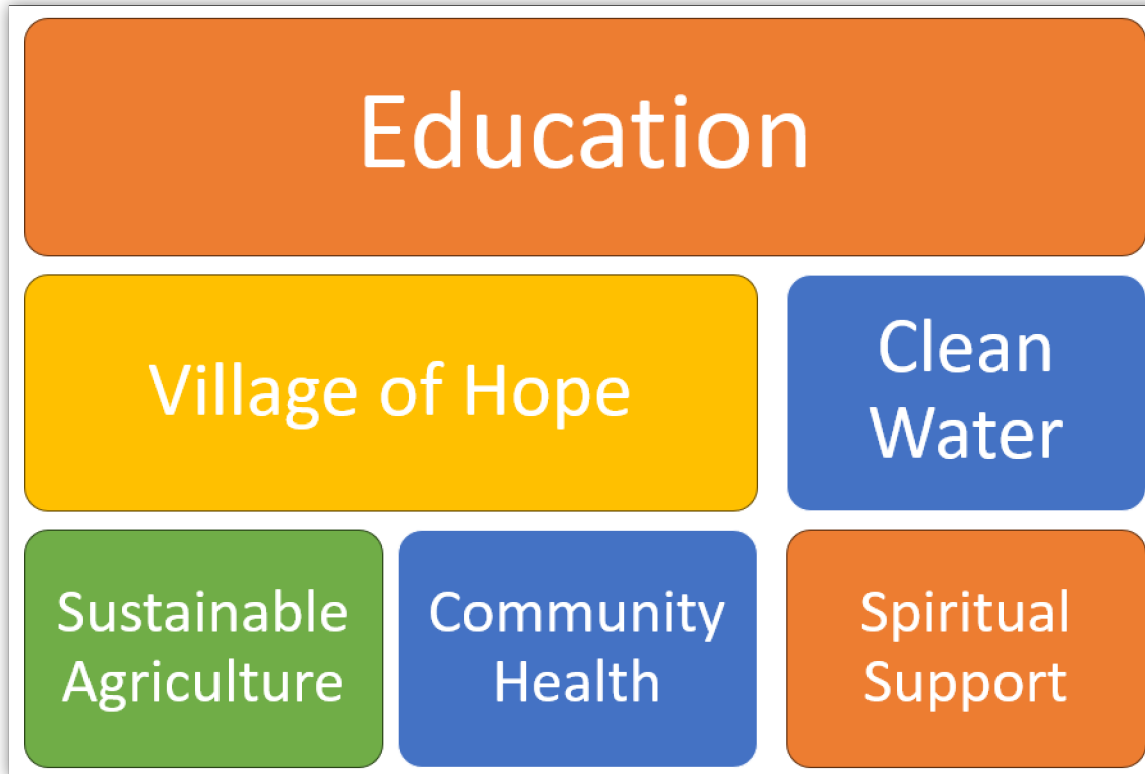
