FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Care of Children: \$202,567

Funds spent on <u>support of</u> <u>seven schools, child</u> <u>sponsorship, education,</u> and <u>care for vulnerable</u> <u>children</u>.

Relief and support: \$42,899

Funds spent on <u>food</u> programs, <u>disaster relief</u>, <u>community health</u>, and <u>church support</u>.

Family and community growth: \$7,569

Funds spent on <u>clean</u> <u>water, sustainable</u> <u>agriculture programs</u>, and <u>family support.</u>

Support of Haitian staff: \$36,988

Funds expended to support in-Haiti ministry, <u>Haiti/U.S.</u> <u>communications</u>, and other program staff support.

Administrative costs: \$128,485

Finance expenses, technology, and administrative costs limited to the U.S.

Fundraising costs: \$38,449

Funds spent on <u>events</u>, marketing, promotion, and organizational capacity growth.
